Management Discussion on Fund Performance

Investment Objective and Strategies

The investment objective of the Exemplar Canadian Focus Portfolio is to achieve superior capital appreciation over both short and long-term horizons primarily through the selection and management of a concentrated group of long and short positions in Canadian equity securities and equity derivative securities.

The Portfolio invests predominantly in large and mid capitalization companies. The Portfolio may also invest in bonds and other debt instruments if warranted by financial conditions. The Portfolio does not specialize in any one industry other than to concentrate investments in those industries that offer the best opportunities for exceptional returns at each stage of the economic and market cycle. The Portfolio may also invest in options, including put options or call options either in respect of a specific security or in respect of a stock exchange index as a means to reduce volatility.

The Portfolio engages in short selling of securities which the portfolio manager believes are overvalued, especially securities of issuers with deteriorating fundamentals and weak balance sheets. Short positions of index securities such as exchange traded funds may also be employed for capital preservation and hedging purposes. Short positions in total may not exceed 40% of the Net Asset Value of the Portfolio. The Portfolio may hold cash or invest in short-term securities for the purpose of preserving capital and/or maintaining liquidity, based upon the portfolio manager's ongoing evaluation of current and anticipated economic and market conditions. The Portfolio may also invest in foreign securities of the same type and characteristics as described above. The Portfolio may invest in derivatives for hedging and non-hedging purposes as permitted by applicable securities laws. The Portfolio may enter into securities lending, repurchase and reverse repurchase transactions to generate additional income or as a short-term cash management tool.

Investment Risk

The risks of investing in the Portfolio remain as stated in the Portfolio's prospectus dated April 27, 2011 (please see "Risk Factors" pages 32 – 38). The principal risks associated with the Portfolio are stock market risk, specific issuer risk, short selling risk, foreign security risk, currency risk and liquidity risk.

The Portfolio is suitable for clients seeking medium to long-term growth (through capital appreciation) who have a moderate risk tolerance level.

Results of Operations

For the twelve month period ending December 31, 2011, Series A shares of the Portfolio declined 6.9%, faring slightly better than the S&P TSX Total Return Index, which declined 8.7% for the same period. Please refer to the Past Performance section for the performance of the other Series. The performance of the other Series offered by the Portfolio differs from Series A largely because of varying levels of expenses charged to each series, as explained in the Management Fee section.

As of December 31, 2011, 70.4% of the Portfolio's net assets were held in Canadian equities or convertible bonds, 3.0% in US equities, 1.3% in global equities and approximately 25.3% in cash. The Portfolio's largest contributors during the period were Open Range Energy and BCE Inc., while the largest detractors were Rainy River Resources and Cameco Corp. We originally bought Open Range because of the unique prospects of its liquids handling subsidiary, which was eventually spun out as Poseidon Concepts with a very attractive dividend yield. We sold Open Range stock right after the Poseidon spin out, but continue to hold our entire Poseidon position, as we see at least another year of exceptional growth ahead.

2011 was a very difficult year characterized by significant volatility across all financial markets. The first half of the year was plagued by a number of adverse events including political unrest in North Africa and the Middle East, the Japanese Tsunami and the Fukushima nuclear disaster as well as continued concerns over sovereign debt issues in Europe. We expected gold stocks, to which the Portfolio had a significant exposure, to become beneficiaries of all

that turbulence and follow bullion's steep rise. Unfortunately investors turned to the precious metal itself for safe haven, viewing gold equities as too risky. Thus many of our gold mining stocks declined substantially, hurting our Portfolio's performance. It became evident that a number of investment firms and traders were making a switch out of gold stocks, which had performed well the year before, into oil stocks, which they viewed as preferred beneficiaries of the Middle East tensions.

We have eventually decided to take profits in a number of precious metals holdings and focus our attention on stocks with more defensive characteristics. Specifically, we focused on dividend yields and companies with solid cash flow growth. We added companies including IBM, Brookfield Asset Management, Telus and Student Transportation. In addition, we added further protection by shorting a number of stocks we felt were vulnerable to further volatility. These included Alcoa, Deutsche Bank, Eldorado Gold and Manulife Financial.

During the second half of the year, economic developments in China became our focus. We became increasingly concerned about the combination of lower GDP growth, rising inflation, and weakening housing market in several regions. Clearly this presented a cause for concern given the significant importance of Chinese demand for Canadian resources. With monetary tightening taking place in China and the U.S. ten year treasury bond yields declining to 2% (signaling increasing fear), we decided to lower our exposure to economically sensitive stocks even further. This was clearly a prudent move given the subsequent declines in major Indexes starting in August.

We fear we are facing a prolonged period of volatility. We see many developments putting a strain on markets – a difficult economic environment in many southern European countries, unrest throughout Syria, growing tensions toward Iran and the possible threat of military intervention. As a result, we continue to emphasize the same strategy we undertook in the second half of last year – focus our stock selection on companies with consistent cash flow growth, especially those which promise to reward their shareholders with increased dividends over time; limit exposure to only the most promising economically sensitive companies and always seek to add short positions in companies which face either structural or valuation issues.

Recent Developments

Exemplar Portfolios Ltd. added a new class to its structure when it filed its prospectus in April 2011. Added to the Exemplar Canadian Focus Portfolio, the Exemplar Global Opportunities Portfolio and the Exemplar Diversified Portfolio is the Exemplar Market Neutral Portfolio, a portfolio that seeks to provide superior absolute returns and to be positively correlated to short-term interest rates. Exemplar Portfolios Ltd. also removed an existing class, the Exemplar Leaders Portfolio, from its structure in June 2011. On January 6, 2012, Exemplar Portfolios Ltd. received approval from the Ontario Securities Commission to begin issuing Series L Shares of the Portfolios. Series L Shares are intended for individual investors purchasing under the low-load sales charge option, whereby no sales commission is charged at the time of purchase, however, a redemption fee may be applicable at the time of redemption.

Related Party Transactions

On April 24, 2008, BluMont Capital seeded the Portfolio with capital of \$50,000 in Series A Shares. BluMont Capital currently holds 510 Series A Shares and 4,595 Series F Shares of the Portfolio.

Management Fees

BluMont Capital Corporation (the "Manager") receives a monthly management fee (the "Management Fee"), calculated as a percentage of the Portfolio's net asset value and is accrued daily and payable monthly. The Management Fee rate applicable to the Portfolio is 1.65% per annum in respect of Series A and Series R Shares and 0.65% per annum in respect of the Series F Shares. For the year ended December 31, 2011 the total Management Fee equaled \$1,050,797. The management fee is paid in consideration of investment management and administration services. No breakdown of such services was specified in the Management Agreement dated March 22, 2011. From this Management Fee, the Manager pays fees to the investment advisor (BluMont Capital, in its capacity as such) who provides portfolio management services to the Portfolio. A portion of the Management

Fee paid by the Portfolio is for trailer fees paid to dealers whose clients hold Shares of the Portfolio. The trailer fees are a percentage of the net asset value of the Portfolio, calculated and payable monthly. The table below outlines the Portfolio's annual Management Fees and trailer fees.

In addition, the Portfolio pays BluMont Capital performance fees ("Performance Fees") equal to 20% of the amount by which the Portfolio return in a year is in excess of the high water mark (the "High Water Mark"), and no Performance Fee is payable unless a hurdle rate of 6% is achieved in that year. Performance Fees will be payable in all circumstances where the performance of the Portfolio exceeds that of its High Water Mark and its hurdle rate. Please refer to the Portfolio's long form prospectus dated April 27, 2011, for further details relating to Performance Fees. The High Water Mark set as of December 31, 2010 was \$14.6959 for Series A Shares, \$15.0048 for Series F Shares, \$14.6633 for Series I Shares and \$12.2956 for Series R Shares. Performance Fees payable for the year ended December 31, 2011 totaled \$2,434. Performance Fees are calculated and accrued daily such that, to the extent possible, the share price each day will reflect any Performance Fees payable as at the end of such day. Performance Fees for the Portfolio will be calculated and accrued each day, but will only be payable following the end of the fiscal year of the Portfolio based on the actual annual performance of the Portfolio.

The Manager incurs operating expenses on behalf of the Portfolio and charges these expenses to the Portfolio. For the year ended December 31, 2011, the Manager has, in its discretion agreed to absorb \$166,100 of operating expenses associated with the Portfolio.

1. The net assets per share are referenced to Net Assets in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") and are derived from the Portfolio's financial statements. The Net Assets presented in the financial statements may differ from the Net Asset Value ("NAV") calculated for Portfolio pricing purposes. NAV is calculated using fair value measures as defined by National Instrument 81-106 ("NI 81-106") whereas, Net Assets are calculated in accordance with Canadian GAAP. An explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to the financial statements. Net Assets are based on the actual number of shares outstanding at the relevant time. The increase from operations is based on the weighted average number of shares outstanding over the financial year. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending Net Assets per share.
2. Distributions were reinvested in additional shares of the Portfolio.
3. Management expense ratio is based on total expenses (excluding commissions and other portfolio transaction costs) for the stated year and is expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the year. The management expense ratio is calculated in accordance with Part 15 of NI 81-106 and therefore includes performance fees, which were previously reported separately as dollar amounts.
4. The Manager has absorbed certain expenses or waived certain fees otherwise payable by the Portfolio. The amount of expenses absorbed or waived is determined annually at the discretion of the Manager and the Manager can terminate the absorption or waiver at any time.
5. The portfolio turnover rate can indicate how actively the Investment Advisor manages the portfolio of investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Portfolio buying and selling all of its securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Portfolio in the year and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Portfolio.

6. The trading expense ratio represents total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.
7. Ratios and supplemental data, where applicable, are computed using the net asset value of the Portfolio.

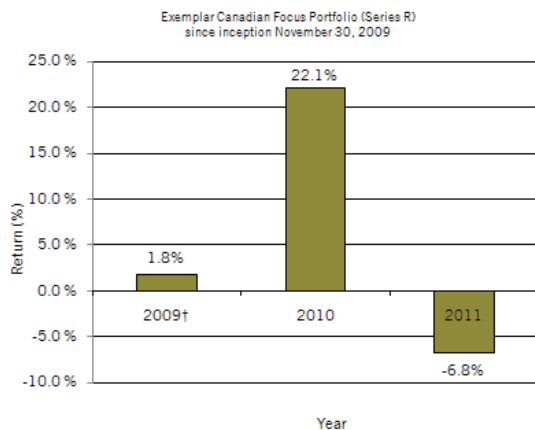
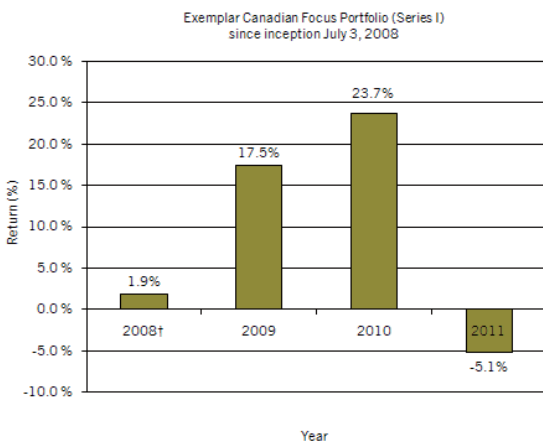
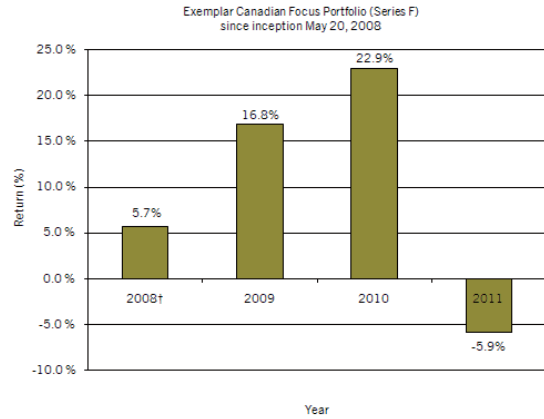
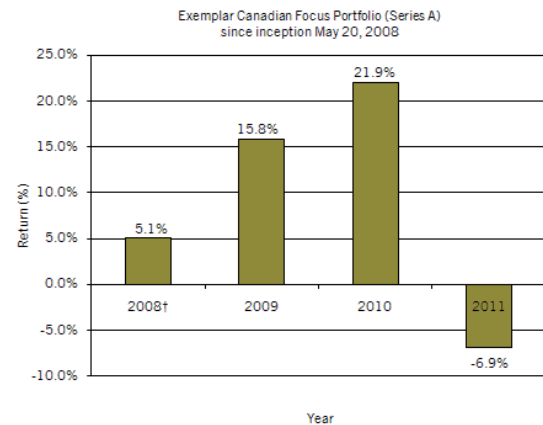
Past Performance

The performance information shown below assumes that all distributions, if any, made by the Portfolio in the periods shown were reinvested in additional shares of the Portfolio. If you hold the Portfolio outside a registered plan, you will be taxed on distributions. Distributions of income the Portfolio earns and capital gains it realizes are taxable in the year received whether received in cash or reinvested in additional shares. No adjustment for potential tax consequences to an investor has been made to the performance information.
