Management Report of Fund Performance

This annual management report of fund performance contains financial highlights but does not contain the complete audited annual financial statements for East Coast Investment Grade Income Fund (the "Fund"). The Fund

The Fund is a closed-end investment trust managed by the Manager. The units of the Fund trade on the Toronto Stock Exchange ("TSX") under the symbol ECF.UN. Through a forward agreement ("Forward Agreement") between the Fund and Bank of Nova Scotia (the "Counterparty"), the Fund is exposed to a portfolio of securities (the "Portfolio") held by ECIGIF Trust. East Coast Fund Management Inc. (the "Portfolio Advisor"), is the portfolio advisor for the Portfolio held by ECIGIF Trust.

Investment Objectives and Strategies

The Fund's investment objectives are to provide unitholders with attractive monthly, tax-advantaged cash distributions, while preserving capital through an actively managed, diversified portfolio of investment grade debt securities of Canadian corporate and government issuers that are rated BBB- or higher by Standard & Poor's, or a similar rating from a qualified rating agency. The portfolio, held by ECIGIF Trust, consists primarily of corporate investment grade debt securities and government bonds. Distributions are targeted to be \$0.05 per month per unit.

The return to investors of the Fund is dependent upon the return of the ECIGIF Trust portfolio pursuant to the Forward Agreement. As a result, this management report of fund performance includes discussion of the performance of ECIGIF Trust, where applicable.

Risks

Risks associated with an investment in the units of the Fund are discussed in the Fund's prospectus dated April 26, 2012 (the "Prospectus"), which is available on the Fund's website at www.arrow-capital.com or on SEDAR at www.sedar.com. There were no changes to the Fund over the year that materially affected the risks associated with an investment in the units of the Fund.

Results of Operations

Investment Portfolio

As of December 31, 2016, ECIGIF Trust's portfolio included a total of 63 [December 31, 2015 - 87] corporate investment grade debt securities held both long and short, the net representing approximately 368.3% [December 31, 2015 - 345.1%] of the net assets of ECIGIF Trust.

As part of its investment strategy, ECIGIF Trust sells government bonds short and invests its proceeds in corporate investment grade debt securities. Incorporating short sales also enhances the portfolio yield and allows ECIGIF Trust to offset some or all of the interest rate risk on that portion of the portfolio. As at December 31, 2016, ECIGIF Trust had \$136.3 million, [December 31, 2015 - \$142.7 million] fixed income short positions and a related unrealized gain of \$1.5 million [December 31, 2015 - \$0.3 million unrealized gain] from short sales.


The breakdown of the portfolio by industry is shown in the accompanying pie chart. A detailed listing of ECIGIF Trust's security holdings is provided in the financial statements.

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Portfolio Sectors



During the year, ECIGIF Trust's portfolio generated net realized and unrealized gains of \$4.3 million [December 31, 2015 – (\$4.9) million], including net realized and unrealized gains from derivatives of \$1.9 million [December 31, 2015 - (\$3.5) million].

Revenues, Expenses and Distributions

Through the Forward Agreement, the Fund participates in interest income and other revenues earned by ECIGIF Trust and expenses of ECIGIF Trust. ECIGIF Trust earned interest income of \$0.66 per Fund unit during the year [December 31, 2015 - \$0.62], including interest expense on short sales. Total combined expenses, of the Fund and ECIGIF Trust for the year ended December 31, 2016 were \$0.45 per Fund unit [December 31, 2015 - \$0.29]. The Fund declared monthly cash distributions to unitholders through the year at the targeted monthly rate of \$0.05 [December 31, 2015 - \$0.05], which totaled \$0.60 per unit for the year [December 31, 2015 - \$0.60].

Net Asset Value

As a result of the Forward Agreement, the Net Asset Value of the Fund is dependent upon the performance of ECIGIF Trust's portfolio. The aggregate Net Asset Value of the Fund as at December 31, 2016 was \$46.1 million, down from \$50.0 million at December 31, 2015. During the year, the Net Asset Value per unit increased by \$0.33, from \$9.15 at December 31, 2015 to \$9.48 as at December 31, 2016 [December 31, 2015 - decrease of \$1.15 from \$10.30 to \$9.15]. There were distributions to unitholders of \$3.2 million during the year.

Liquidity

To provide liquidity for unitholders, units of the Fund are listed on the TSX under the symbol ECF.UN. For the year, units of the Fund traded at an average discount to their Net Asset Value per unit of (7.3%) [December 31, 2015 – discount (3.8%)]. Investors may also redeem their units in accordance with the Fund's redemption provisions.

Redemption

The Fund had redemptions during the year of \$5.7 million [December 31, 2015 - \$35.2 million].

Recent Developments

There are no recent developments for the Fund.

Related Party Transactions

Related party transactions consist of services provided by the Manager pursuant to a management agreement. See the Management Fees section below.

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Management Fees

Pursuant to a management agreement, the Manager provides management and administrative services to the Fund, for which the Fund pays management fees and service fees, equal on a combined basis to 0.65% per annum of the total Net Asset Value of the Fund, plus applicable taxes. The service fee is 0.40% per annum of the Net Asset Value of the Fund. The service fee is in turn paid by the Manager to investment dealers based on the proportionate number of units held by clients of each dealer at the end of each calendar quarter. During the year ended December 31, 2016, management fees and service fees amounted on a combined basis to \$0.8 million [December 31, 2015 - \$1.4 million], with \$0.20 million [December 31, 2015 - \$0.3 million] attributable to service fees. In addition, the Manager is responsible for providing management and administrative services to ECIGIF Trust and for paying the fees of ECIGIF Trust's Portfolio Advisor. ECIGIF Trust pays management fees equal to 1.00% per annum of the Net Asset Value of ECIGIF Trust, plus applicable taxes. The management fees and service fees from the Fund and ECIGIF Trust are used by the Manager to cover its costs for its services in connection with the management of the Fund, the cost of the Portfolio Advisor and for profit.

No Performance Fee will be charged by the Fund. The Manager is entitled to receive from the ECIGIF Trust an annual Performance Fee equal to 10% of the increase in the Net Asset Value of the ECIGIF Trust (including distributions paid on the units of ECIGIF Trust), subject to an annual hurdle rate of 5.30%. The Manager earned \$637,281 in Performance Fees during the year [December 31, 2015 - \$nil] from ECIGIF Trust.

Financial Highlights

The following tables show selected key financial information about the Fund and are intended to help readers understand the Fund's financial performance. This information is derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. *The information in the following tables is presented in accordance with National Instrument ("NI") 81-106 and, as a result, does not act as a continuity of opening and closing Net Assets per unit.* The increase (decrease) in Net Assets from operations is based on average units outstanding during the year, and all other numbers are based on actual units outstanding at the relevant point in time.

The net assets per unit shown for prior years are referenced to Net Assets determined in accordance with Canadian generally accepted accounting principles ("GAAP") and are derived from the Fund's audited annual financial statements. The Net Assets presented in the audited annual financial statements may differ from the NAV calculated for fund pricing purposes. NAV is calculated using fair value measures as defined by National Instrument 81-106 ("NI 81-106"), where as Net Assets are calculated in accordance with IFRS/GAAP. An explanation of these differences can be found in the notes to the audited annual financial statements. Net Assets per unit and distributions per unit are based on the actual number of

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units outstanding at the relevant time. The increase/decrease from operations is based on the weighted average number of units outstanding over the financial year. This table is not intended to be a reconciliation of beginning to ending net assets per unit.

(1) MER is based on the requirements of NI 81-106 and includes the total expenses (excluding commissions, margin interest, security borrowing costs, and other portfolio transaction costs) of the Fund and ECIGIF Trust for the stated period, including issuance costs, and is expressed as an annualized percentage of the average Net Asset Value of the period.

(2) The trading expense ratio represents total commissions, margin interest, and security borrowing costs of the Fund and ECIGIF Trust expressed as an annualized percentage of the daily average Net Asset Value of the Fund during the period.

(3) The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's Portfolio Advisor manages its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher the Fund's portfolio turnover rate in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund. Portfolio turnover rate is calculated by dividing the lesser of the cost of purchases and the proceeds of sales of portfolio securities of ECIGIF Trust for the period, excluding cash and short-term investments maturing in less than one year, by the average market value of investments of ECIGIF Trust during the period.



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Portfolio Advisor

East Coast Fund Management Inc. ("ECFMI"), incorporated under Business Corporations Act (Ontario) on June 22, 2009, is the portfolio advisor of the ECIGIF Trust. ECFMI is responsible for all portfolio advisory and investment management services that are provided to ECIGIF Trust.

Portfolio Advisor Report

For the 12 months ended December 31st 2016, the Fund posted a gain of 10.5% (2015: (5.6%)) while its benchmark, the FTSE TMX Canada Universe Bond Index, gained +1.7% for the same period (2015: 3.5%).

2016 had some significant events that caught the markets off guard (Brexit, U.S. Election...) as well as being a year that finally caught up with long-only fixed income investors once rates began rising across the globe in October. While it has been a strong-performing year for credit, we feel that the year ahead still provides plenty of opportunities for investors.

During the first quarter of the year credit spreads widened dramatically to non-crises wides. Our insight and understanding of the credit markets led us to believe that this was an opportunity, not a sign of an impending market crash. During this time we added to high-quality names and were able to buy senior, investment grade debt at very attractive levels from risk/reward standpoint. This proved to be very profitable and the losses we saw in January were more than made up for by the end of March.

During the year we also began taking advantage of the preferred share market's inability to properly value out of favor legacy shares. Through in depth and thorough analysis we carefully added positions to the portfolio and were able to benefit investors. Our best performing investment in preferred shares was in Enbridge Series U. Early in the year we were buying these at \$15 and they ended the year over \$22.

2016 Key Themes

It was a year of surprise that rewarded investors who had both caution and conviction. Oil fell to a low of \$26/bbl yet finished the year around \$53/bbl. The Canadian Dollar performed incredibly well given its international counterparts underperformance as central bank policies diverged from the FOMC's rate hike during the tail end of the year.

For interest rates the big story was twofold, rates began rising (even before the U.S. election so it can't all be blamed on that) and yield curves steepened. The driver of the steepening was a rise in inflation expectations which began rising after investors realized that regardless of who won the election, fiscal stimulus was going to be a big part of the next administration.

Credit spreads started the year at incredibly wide levels and went even wider. They snapped back fairly rapidly so it required more than luck to benefit from this initial movement. The rest of the year saw credit spreads grind tighter as economic outlooks improved and interest rates began to rise.
